Adding Habitat to Club Lakes



Artificial Habitat Added to Broseco Ranch: Caresend Lake

Adding habitat to our club lakes is a huge benefit to our fisherman and our fish. Habitat can take many forms: from rocks, old tires, tree limbs, to some of the newer artificial plastic trees and shrubs on the market. For most of our lakes we use freshly cut red cedar trees sunk with cinder block. We know that these brush piles create an environment where small bait fish have a refuge to hide, relax and feed in and around this safe haven. During our shock surveys we can get on brush piles to be a magnet not only for the bait fish but for bass and routinely find our most productive places to electroshock are brush piles. attraction to brush piles leads to better recruitment.

Recruitment quite simply means the fish are making lots and lots of babies. There are several national studies that we are following closely that are helping to answer how bluegill and bass recruitment are enhanced by habitat. In the meantime, PWF continues to partner with our landowners to add habitat to our club lakes. In most cases, we mark our brush piles with a piece of rebar sleeved with white irrigation pipe. PWF has added both artificial and non artificial habitat to more than a dozen club lakes
